2008 Spring Grants Awarded to Pendleton Community

he Board of Directors of the Pendleton Foundation Trust announced allocations totaling \$119,261 to 15 community organizations and \$1,807 to 8 memorial trust funds in April.

Recipients of current grants include:

- PENDLETON SKATE PARK, remaining pledge of \$15,000.00 toward the construction of a new skate park in the Westgate area of Pendleton near Bob White Field.
- CITY OF PENDLETON, PARKS DEPT., \$10,000.00 toward the Community Park rehabilitation project, which includes completion of the ball field fencing.
- CITY OF PENDLETON, FIRE & AMBULANCE, \$14,175.00 to purchase one AutoPulse Non-invasive Cardiac Support Pump.
- PENDLETON CONVENTION CENTER, \$5,000.00 to purchase additional Versalite Stage panels for use at the convention center.
- WASHINGTON ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, \$7,337.00 to purchase a new copy machine.
- McKAY CREEK ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, \$3,744.00 to

purchase 15 two-student desks and 30 student chairs.

- UMATILLA-MORROW E.S.D., \$5,995.00 to purchase a teaching Greenhouse for the Pendleton Alternative School site for students to meet their lab science graduation credit. The program will be run as a cooperative effort by the ESD and the OSU Master Gardeners and will benefit not only the students, but the Pendleton Community Gardens program that provides several thousand pounds of produce to the Pendleton Senior Center and the Salvation Army.
- **PENDLETON CENTER FOR THE ARTS,** \$835.00 to purchase button machines, tools and materials for the youth arts education programs, which serve approximately 700 young people annually.
- OREGON EAST SYMPHONY & CHORALE, \$570.00 to purchase 2 sidewalk signs to advertise upcoming concerts and events for the community.
- PENDLETON UNDERGROUND TOURS, \$9,000.00
 to repair and replace glass in windows and repair damaged
 awnings for the historic Hendricks building.
- 2010 MAIN STREET COMMITTEE, \$3,770.00 toward

the cost of brackets to be permanently installed on each lamp post on Main Street that will bear the weight of hanging flower baskets from May through September of each year.

- VETERANS OF FOREIGN WARS, POST #922, \$6,273.00 to build a 24'x30' shelter with running water and drinking water at Stillman Park.
- ROUND-UP ASSOCIATION, INC., \$5,000.00 to seal and preserve the concrete floor in the Roy Raley Room.
- PENDLETON ROUND-UP AND HAPPY CANYON HALL OF FAME, \$9,000.00, toward the construction and installation of a new sign on Court Avenue to attract visitors to the museum and gift shop.
- PENDLETON LITTLE LEAGUE BASEBALL & SOFT-BALL, \$3,562.00 to purchase building materials for the scorers and storage building for softball #3 project.
- PENDLETON ASA SOFTBALL, \$20,000.00 to purchase 3 sets of aluminum bleachers for the softball field at Sunridge Middle School. This is part of the field upgrade project. Pendleton High School softball teams and several other teams use the field.
